What we are learning about:

Numeracy



This term our numeracy focus will be:

- Finding fractions and percentages of an amount.
- Measuring and drawing angles.
- Adding and subtracting up to 2 decimal numbers.
- Multiplication and division strategies.

We will continue to use Glasgow Counts starter activities and counting routines to reinforce multiplication tables and to improve number sense and confidence.

Literacy



Reading: Pupils will continue to develop their reciprocal reading skills and ability to respond to a range of questions. The class will also apply their skills in learning some parts for the school show through their drama lessons.

Writing: This term pupils will develop their knowledge of 2 text types, Discussion which gives a balanced view on a subject or topic and Explanation which includes information about causes, motives and reasons behind a topic or subject. Pupils will also continue to apply their writing skills across the curriculum.

Listening & Talking: Debates are the main focus for our talking and listening skills in term 4. Pupils will work on developing a series of opinions or facts to back up what they are saying to their opposing partners.

Health and Wellbeing

This term we will focus on football and athletics to develop our skills to help us be successful in sports day.

Drama

Pupils will continue to develop their performing skills by practising for the school show.
